The Department of Economics at the University of Toronto St. George campus invites applications for a three-year **Contractually Limited-Term Appointment** at the rank of **Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream**. The expected start date of this appointment is July 1, 2016 ending on June 30, 2019.

We seek enthusiastic and innovative individuals pursuing a career in university teaching. Candidates must have a demonstrated record of excellent teaching and have earned a Ph.D. in Economics by the start date of the appointment, or shortly thereafter. Successful candidates must present clear evidence of both ability and ambition to significantly enhance the reputation of our undergraduate Economics program, and exert creative educational leadership at the level of courses, programs, and the university. Teaching duties are in the undergraduate program, and will include some core courses at the first and/or second year level, and possibly an upper-level course in one of the candidate's fields of research.

Excellence in teaching can be demonstrated by teaching accomplishments highlighted as part of the application, a creative and coherent teaching statement, endorsements from referees, and evidence of strong communication and expository skills.

Salary is to be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
