Contractually Limited-Term Appointment - Assistant Professor - Teaching Stream

The Department of Economics at the University of Toronto St. George campus invites applications for four two-year **Contractually Limited-Term Appointments at the rank of Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream** beginning on July 1, 2016 and ending on June 30, 2018.

We seek enthusiastic individuals with the ability and ambition to advance our department's rigorous, highly-ranked undergraduate programs. Candidates must have earned a Ph.D. in Economics by the start date of the appointment or shortly thereafter. The successful candidate must have strong endorsements from referees, excellent communication and expository skills, ability to expertly incorporate current research (from at least two fields) into our undergraduate courses, and a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching. While the ideal candidate has a record of excellence in teaching, candidates with a record of excellence in communicating research findings will also be considered. Evidence of excellence in teaching can be demonstrated by endorsements from referees, teaching accomplishments highlighted as part of the application, teaching evaluations, dossier and/or syllabi. Evidence of excellence in communicating research findings can be demonstrated through the expository skills evident in a candidate's research papers, presentation slides, conference presentations and letters of reference. The successful candidate must also possess strong interpersonal skills, including the ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues on our undergraduate courses and programs. Teaching duties are in the undergraduate program, and will include core courses at the first and/or second year level.

Salary is to be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Application should be submitted online <http://www.economics.utoronto.ca/apply>. Review of applications will begin on April 7, 2016, and the positions will be open until filled. A completed application will include a curriculum vitae, a creative and coherent teaching dossier that highlights teaching accomplishments (including a teaching statement, course outlines, course evaluations, select course materials), one or more working papers, presentation slides/materials, and at least three letters of reference.
