Course Overview

Agency and incomplete information problems inherent in financial transactions; the role of contractual arrangements in overcoming them. Financial constraints on investment decisions of firms; the financial system in economic growth; the legal system in the functioning of financial markets. A look at theoretical and empirical literature covering these issues.

This course covers advanced topics in corporate finance, including, investment, optimal capital structure, option pricing. The course provides both theoretical treatment of the topics as well as applications to recent events and case studies. To excel in the class, students should be good in both solving math-based questions as well as applying theories to discuss practical problems.
