Course Overview

Theory of markets and prices. Determination of prices through the interaction of the basic economic units, the household as consumer and as supplier of inputs and the business firm as producer and as employer of inputs. The pricing system as the mechanism by which social decisions and allocation of goods are made in a market economy.

This course is the foundation of almost any microeconomics course that you take in the future. Learning microeconomics theory helps you think about microeconomic problems in a more structured way by formulating them in math. It will teach you to solve optimizations and explain consumers' and firms' behavior and decision-making processes. We will also discuss real-world applications of the tools we learn in this course.
