### **Eligibility:**

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria by the end of the 2019 summer session:

- Completed one course in <u>each</u> of the three 200-level groups listed below (with A- or higher in two or more of the three courses):
  - Microeconomics: ECO 200Y/204Y/206Y
  - Macroeconomics: ECO 202Y/208Y/209Y
  - Econometrics: ECO 220Y/227Y / STA257H+261H
- Be a 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year student in the Economics major/specialists programs, or in the Rotman Commerce programs.
- Have a cumulative GPA (CGPA) of 3.5 or higher.

Additional criteria that will be considered:

- Evidence of leadership potential and excellent communication skills.
- Previous peer tutoring experience considered an asset.

### **Roles and Responsibilities:**

Upon appointment learning assistants are expected to:

- Hold either a one 4-hour session per week or two 2-hour sessions per week from September 2019 through April 2020. These sessions will be scheduled during regular hours (Mondays through Fridays).
- Attend the <u>mandatory</u> Learning Assistants Orientation and Training session.
- Sign-in and sign-out of each session.
- Notify the staff advisor of any student in difficulty.
- Maintain session logs which are to be submitted electronically each week to the staff advisor.
- Administer and respond to evaluations.
- Submit a report with your feedback of the Study Center in December 2019 and April 2020 to the staff advisor.

#### Remuneration:

Economics Study Center Learning Assistants are paid the undergraduate TA wage rate (currently \$45.33/hour).
